ELECTRICAL SAFETY WHILE WORKING FROM HOME

For many of us, the new social distancing rules mean that our homes have become our home offices. Whether you're working in a dedicated home office space, the kitchen table or from a laptop in the family room, please ensure that you are practising good electrical safety habits that will help reduce the risk of shock or fire. The <u>Electrical Safety Foundation International</u> (<u>ESFI</u>) has assembled a list of tips that encourage you to review and make part of your new work-from-home practices.

- Avoid overloading electrical outlets
- Unplug appliances when not in use to save energy and minimize the risk of shock or fire
- Inspect electrical cords and extension cords for damage
- Extension cords should only be used temporarily
- Never plug a space heater or fan into an extension cord or power strip
- Never run cords under rugs/carpets or doors
- Make sure cords do not become tripping hazards
- Keep papers and other potential combustibles at least three feet away from space heaters and other heat sources
- Use proper wattage for lamps/lighting
- Make sure your home has smoke alarms. Test them monthly, change batteries yearly, and replace them every 10 years

We also encourage you to keep a fire extinguisher in your home office.
