KIDDE RECALLS DUAL-SENSOR SMOKE ALARMS

Identify Your Smoke Alarm

Compare your alarm model to other smoke alarm models. Affected units are identical to the alarm featured in the green box. All other smoke alarms are not affected by this product notice.

Look for this pill shaped design on the front of the unit. This feature is slightly raised and is unique to this alarm.

If your alarm matches this design, please proceed to the next step.

If you have Kidde dual-sensor smoke alarms, please be advised that there is a recall currently in effect due to a potential safety issue in which a yellow cap can cover one of the two smoke sensors, which compromises the smoke alarms' ability to detect smoke.

This recall involves two models (PI2010CA and PI9010CA) of Kidde dual-sensor (photoelectric and ionization) smoke alarms manufactured between September 10, 2016 and October 13, 2017. The model number and date code are located on the back of the unit. The affected smoke alarms have a pill shaped design on the front of the unit. The affected models have a yellow cap visible through the opening on the side of the alarm. [Click here for all the details and how to see if your smoke alarm is affected.](#)

Consumers should immediately contact Kidde to receive instructions on how to identify the presence of the yellow sensor cap and request a free replacement smoke alarm if their smoke alarm contains the yellow cap. Affected smoke alarms should be removed and discarded only after the replacement alarm has been received. GOODBYE WINTER ... HELLO SPRING CLEANING!

Did you know that outdoor property maintenance and indoor spring cleaning can help boost your home's security? There are a number of things that you can do at this time of year to improve the level of security in and around your property ...

Inside the Home:

1. **Test your smoke and [carbon monoxide detectors](#).**
 - a. Ensure that smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms all have new batteries and are in good working order.
 - b. Clean your battery powered smoke and carbon monoxide alarms as per the manufacturer's instructions, to ensure that dust isn't impeding the sensor.
 - c. If your alarms are hard-wired, make sure to vacuum the outside of the vents as well.
 - d. If your smoke alarms or detectors are monitored, please call our monitoring station (1.888.363.9311) and put your system on test. This will help to prevent a false dispatch if something should happen during cleaning.
 - e. Lastly, check the expiry date on both devices. Generally if they have been in service for 10 or more years, we recommend replacing them.
2. Check to see if your **fire extinguishers need to be serviced** and [bring them to Huronia](#) for maintenance and inspections - [click here for more details](#).
3. **Clean out the dryer vent** ... after a long winter of drying warm and woolly clothes, there is likely a buildup of lint that could cause a fire. We also recommend that residents have a smoke alarm installed in (or near) the laundry room to act, as an early warning sign should a fire break out.
4. [Contact us](#) to schedule an annual inspection of your system.

Outside the Home:

1. Check the bulbs on your **motion detector lights**.
2. **Examine windows and exterior doors** for damage and wear and tear. Make sure all the locks are in proper working order. [Need a new set of keys cut or door hardware replaced? Get in touch with our Lock, Key & Safe team.](#)
3. Ensure that your property is **free and clear of branches and leaves** that may have fallen over the course of the winter. If emergency response personnel need to access your property, you want to ensure there is unobstructed access.
