
DO YOU KNOW WHAT A FLASHING GREEN LIGHT ON A VEHICLE MEANS?

If you saw a green flashing light in a vehicle behind you, would you know what that meant? And would you know what to do?

A flashing green light is an indication that a volunteer firefighter is on the way to an emergency situation. It is estimated that there are 19,000 volunteer firefighters in Ontario that are driving personal vehicles equipped with these green flashing lights.

If you see this flashing green light, please attempt to pull over and let this vehicle pass. At present, you are not legally required to pull over, as in the case of pulling over for a fire truck, ambulance or police car with their lights and sirens on, however, in doing so you may be assisting firefighting efforts in your community.

The use of the flashing green lights is exclusive to the Ontario fire service.



BE WARM AND SAFE THIS WINTER!

According to our colleagues at the [National Fire Protection Association](#), half of home heating equipment fires are reported during the months of December, January and February.

- The NFPA recommends keeping anything that can burn (curtains, blankets, newspaper, clothing, etc.) at least one metre away from heating equipment (furnace, fireplace, wood stove and portable space heaters)
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when you leave the room, or go to bed.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month to ensure they are in good working order, and ensure that there is a working smoke alarm on every storey and outside all sleeping areas in your home
- Have all fuel burning appliances inspected (visit [COSafety.ca](#) to find a licensed contractor near you)
