HOME SECURITY. DETECTION & PREVENTION. WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW.

There have been a number of recent news releases from our colleagues at the Southern Georgian Bay Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) with regards to home safety and security including daytime break and enters that resulted in thefts of small household items, cash and jewelry and an unrelated incident of voyeurism/trespassing. We would like to take this opportunity to provide you with the following home safety tips from the OPP, to help protect yourself, your family and neighbours from unwanted visitors. Please remember that should you discover a break and enter, please contact the OPP immediately at 1-888-310-1122. **Do not enter your property as valuable evidence may be disturbed.**

Detection:

- Keep your eyes and ears open for suspicious vehicles and persons in the area of your residence. Do not confront possible suspects.
- Record the licence numbers and description of suspicious vehicles.
- Record detailed descriptions of occupants of suspicious vehicles.
- Report your concerns and observations immediately to the Ontario Provincial Police Communications Centre at 1-888-310-1122 or "911" if you believe the situation to be an emergency - some of our customers will have other police jurisdictions that serve their locales
- Make "would-be" thieves visible by installing motion lights or leave an exterior light on to illuminate entrance ways and rear yards.
- Don't hide keys in secret places. Instead leave a duplicate with a friend or neighbour.

Prevention:

- Lock your doors and secure any open windows prior to retiring for the evening.
- Consider motion sensor lights to illuminate the exterior of your residence.
- Borrow an engraver from your local OPP detachment to engrave your valuable belongings. This may discourage theft of valuables and will provide an easy way to identify stolen property.
- Record the serial numbers and contents of your home on paper or using a video camera.
- Don't leave articles out, such as axes and tools that could be used to assist in breaking into your residence.
- Establish relationships with neighbours and check on each other's property when away.
- If you are away, make sure that your residence looks like it is occupied. Have the sidewalks shoveled, the mail collected, and the grass cut. Make use of timers to have lights coming on and going off at different intervals.
- Avoid posting on social media sites when you are away from your residence.
- Lock and secure your property and outside belongings and if warranted inquire of the feasibility of an alarm system.
