## PROTECTING YOURSELF AND YOUR FAMILY FROM THE SILENT KILLER

The colder weather is upon us. And that means that we'll need to heat our homes to stay warm and cosy as the snow begins to fly. That also means that there is an increased risk of undetected carbon monoxide in your home. Often referred to as the silent killer (poisoning), carbon monoxide has no odour, no colour and no taste and is often difficult to detect until it is too late.

According to recent statistics, over 65% of all carbon monoxide deaths and illnesses in Ontario occur in homes. It is the leading cause of accidental poisonings in Ontario every year. Many residences in Ontario have between 4-6 fuel (propane, gasoline, natural gas heating and oil or wood) burning appliances that produce carbon monoxide, including; furnace, boiler, fireplace, stove, BBQ, clothes dryer, water heater, space heater, portable generator and vehicles.

To keep you, your family and pets safe from carbon monoxide poisoning, illness or even death it is recommended to have an annual inspection and maintenance of all fuel-burning appliances. Poor maintenance puts you at risk. Ontario laws require smoke and carbon monoxide alarms be installed in your home. Contact your local fire department for information on the number and location of alarms. Remember to replace the batteries at least once per year.

Make yourself familiar with the symptoms of CO poisoning:



Nausea



Burning Eyes



Headache



Drowsiness



Loss of Consciousness



Confusion

**If symptoms appear, get everyone (including pets) outside to fresh air immediately and then call 911.**

Here are some additional DO's and DON'TS, from our associates at the [Technical Standards and Safety Authority](#), when it comes to carbon monoxide safety ...

- Do: Have your home/cottage heating system, fireplace and flue inspected and cleaned by a qualified technician every year.
- Do: Keep chimneys clear of bird and squirrel nests, leaves, and other debris to ensure proper ventilation.
- Do: Ensure your furnace and other appliances, such as gas ovens, ranges, and cooktops, are inspected for adequate ventilation.
- Do: Have your gas fireplaces inspected each fall to ensure the pilot light burns safely.
- Do: Always make sure your fuel-burning appliances have an adequate air supply to prevent a CO hazard.
- Don't: Use portable fuel-fired appliances (i.e., portable barbecue, heater, stove) inside your house or garage.
- Don't: Operate gasoline-powered engines in confined areas such as garages, basements or boathouses.
- Don't: Do not leave your car, mower, ATV or other vehicle running in an attached garage, even with the door open.
- Don't: Block or seal shut exhaust flues or ducts for appliances such as water heaters, ranges, and clothes dryers.
